We still have many students with missing assignments but we have started providing spaces for working lunches and assigning ASD's to give students additional time to finish work, as needed. Classwork is part of each teacher's way to assess learning so it is important that assignments are completed. Clearsight Testing: Middle School students will complete their third round of Clearsight testing March 11-13. All students will need headphones for testing. Headphones are available for purchase from our technology department for $\$ 1$.

Being Prepared for Class: We have continued to have students showing up to class without required materials such as pencils, paper, folders, homework, and chromebooks that are charged. Most classrooms are charging a student with a tardy if they have to return to their lockers to obtain materials or if their device needs to be charged and they have to get a charger from their locker. Please stress to your student how important it is to use their passing period wisely and show up to class with required materials.

NHS Tutoring: Tutoring that has been offered each Thursday afternoon after school is canceled for the rest of this 9 weeks. We will send out information if we are able to offer it during the 4th 9-weeks.

3rd 9-weeks Grades: Please be sure to stay up to date with 3rd 9-week academic progress and communicate any questions to teachers. The end of the 3rd 9-week grading period is Friday, March 15th.

Changes in Procedures during the School Day: You may hear your student talking about a few changes that have been made at school. These changes are being made around the building during transitions between classes, to/from lunch, and with restrooms. These modifications are being implemented to help us provide additional safety and security for students during unstructured times.

Horseplay: We continue to address "horseplay" and "hands on" issues as they occur. As identified throughout the year, horseplay often starts out as "play" but can sometimes escalate quickly into anger, leading to someone getting hurt. When we have conversations with students about horseplay, they struggle to see anything wrong with it because they are "friends" with the other person and they were just "joking around." Overall, we continue to find that many of our students are having a hard time respecting each other's boundaries. There are consequences in the handbook for horseplay including ASD, SMD, and OSS. Please be sure to discuss this with your student. Help us be proactive and keep everyone safe.

## 3rd 9-weeks Incentive: January 15 - March 13, 2024

To be eligible to participate in the incentive on March 15th, students must achieve the following things from 1/15/24-3/13/24:

- No overall grades lower than a C
- No unexcused absences (Parent verified absence UP TO FIVE per semester - See page 18 of the student handbook for more information.)
- No behavior referrals from the classroom or office
- NEW: $10 \%$ or more increase on Clearsight assessments
- Any combination of growth in ELA or Math that equals $10 \%$ or more

The incentive activity on March 15th will be structured and will include snacks plus a variety of activities for students to participate in and enjoy with friends:

Chromebooks: Please talk with your students about taking care of their devices.Chromebooks are used throughout the day so it is important that students keep them charged and in good working condition.

Phones/Earbuds: Students do not need their phones during the school day. There is a phone at the front office that can be utilized, upon request, if a parent needs to be contacted during school hours. Please be sure to remind your student that phones are not allowed in class, should be powered off, and kept in lockers during the school day. Phones will be confiscated during class and earbuds may be confiscated if students make the choice to use them. If you receive a notification that your student's device has been confiscated during class, they can be picked up at the middle school office between 8am-3:30pm daily.

Tardies: Being on time to class with the correct materials is a huge expectation and being tardy more than twice will result in office level consequences.

5th through 9th Tardy - Saturday Morning Detention for each
Over 9 Tardies - Suspension Pending Expulsion
