Friendly reminder about testing days:

- All students will need earbuds or headphones on testing days. They cannot be Bluetooth/Airpods per the IDOE. Earbuds are available to purchase at school for \$1, if needed. Each testing teacher will keep student earbuds or headphones in a tote with the student's name on them so we have everything ready to go on testing days. Earbuds will be returned to students once testing is complete.
- Cell phones, smart watches, and/or any other unauthorized devices are not allowed in the testing rooms and is a testing violation with the IDOE. Please reinforce with your

child that these devices are not allowed in testing sessions. As always, students are asked to keep devices powered down in their locker during the school day.

• All students should bring a CHARGED Chromebook, paper, pencil and a book or reading material to their testing room each day.

Similar to our everyday Rebel Strong tickets, students will have a chance to earn ILEARN Effort tickets during testing weeks. Effort Tickets can be earned in two ways: *on time arrival/charged chromebook* and *effort*. Students will place tickets in a grade-level tub to enter daily drawings for various prizes.
